President's Message

Hello Carrolltowne community!

I'd like to diverge from my typical message of what the PTA has done for the school community and take this opportunity to explain our purposes, as outlined in our bylaws:

- To promote the welfare of children and youth in home, school, places of worship, and throughout the community
- To raise the standards of home life
- To advocate for laws that further the education, physical and mental health, welfare, and safety of children and youth
- To promote the collaboration and engagement of families and educators in the education of children and youth
- To engage the public in united efforts to secure the physical, mental, emotional, spiritual, and social well-being of all children and youth
- To advocate for fiscal responsibility regarding public tax dollars in public education funding

In a typical year, we fulfill our stated purposes by sponsoring assemblies, field trips, social activities, and other classroom and extracurricular experiences, which thanks to our generous community, we're easily able to do year after year. (Most PTAs are not this fortunate.) However, with this year's limitations, we've not been able to do these things and now have a surplus of funds—more than enough to close out this year and begin next year comfortably. Our April 8th meeting covered two very large topics that touched on these purposes: grant money for the school and the revoked charter for the Maryland State PTA.

Every child at Carrolltowne spends an hour in the art room each week. If you've been in this room, you've probably noticed that the cabinets are long overdue for replacing. At an estimated replacement cost of \$31,000, and because we just received a new roof two years ago, the cabinets have fallen to the bottom of the list of district-wide maintenance and repairs. The school recently was informed that they have \$15,000 they must use immediately, so we were approached by administration to see if we had the funds and were willing to provide a grant to the school to cover the remaining costs. We were also asked to replace seven broken printers for several grades, the computer lab, the nurse's office, and the guidance counselor, as well as a projector for the pre-K classroom, at a cost of \$4,538.02. This, of course, could not happen without a vote of the broader community.

At the April 8th meeting and during an enlightening and informative email conversation afterward between the 14 PTA members who had been present, we debated the pros and cons of approving the disbursement of funds for these items and how they aligned with our purposes. We ultimately voted unanimously to provide the funds for the cabinets and 11–3 to replace the requested technology.

We also discussed the National PTA's revocation of Maryland State PTA's charter. Maryland State PTA was placed on probation last year, with one year to become compliant and rectify accusations of a toxic environment. They failed to do so by March. The dissolving of the Maryland PTA affects little in our day-to-day operations for now, as we now fall under the umbrella of the National PTA until a new state PTA is established. When that eventually happens, we will need to update and revise our bylaws to submit to the new state PTA for approval.

On average we send more than \$1,600 in dues a year to the state and National PTAs. We are currently exploring the value of remaining a PTA versus transitioning to a PTO distinct from the National PTA and are planning on revisiting this topic at the next meeting on May 6.

These discussions are enriched by having more voices in the room. Votes cannot take place without meeting quorum (12 dues-paying members). Because of the 14 members at April 8's meeting, Carrolltowne was able to take advantage of the district's funds, and our children will benefit from new cabinets in their art room. Most meetings are not this pressing, but each meeting is helpful, not just to the running of PTA business but also to our children's school.


